WORKSHOP

Valuable advice and coaching in relation to specific scores or general career aims provided by an industry professional/judge. **1-to-1 session** provided to finalists ahead of the final performance of their piece to discuss their performance intentions and inspiration behind the composition.

All finalists' work will be **recorded** in high quality, and publicised on the Phoenix Consort **social media** channels, with the aim of increasing opportunity for future performance of compositions. These recordings will also be free to use to our composers for their own publicity.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Accessibility is very important to us - if you require any alternative means to enter the competition please get in touch with adam@phoenixconsort.com.

SCORING: Unaccompanied SATB, divisi up to SSAATTBB (divisi is not a requirement).

REQUIREMENTS: UK Resident. The competition is aimed at emerging composers: those who are in the process of establishing a professional career and developing their artistic profile.

Our brief for this year surrounds the texts of **Emily Dickinson**. Please submit an unaccompanied work between **2.5-4 minutes** long, suitable for performance by up to 20 members of the Phoenix Consort. You are free to include solos, semi-chorus sections, or use the full choir throughout. The piece can contain contemporary elements and complex harmonic features if desired, but should still remain approachable in difficulty for a confident amateur choir. Applicants are limited to one entry.

Examples of **texts** include: 'Hope is a thing with feathers', 'My river runs to thee', 'Heart! We will forget him!', 'I died for Beauty', 'I can wade Grief', 'Unable are the Loved to die', and any other text by Emily Dickinson listed on the Poetry Foundation Website.

It is not necessary to incorporate the entire text in the composition.

ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS

- Your Full Name, Contact Email Address, Phone Number, Date of Birth, City of Residence.
- A Music CV/Short detail of musical experience.
- A PDF of your score.
- An MP3 file/MIDI Audio of the piece., if possible.
- A brief description (250 words approx.) of the piece, your intentions for its performance and the writing process.
- A short sentence/two sentences explaining how you would use the possible prize money.
